### FABIO MASINI



Fabio Masini is a Full Professor of History and Theories of International Economic Relations at the Roma Tre University where he also holds a Jean Monnet Chair on European Economic Governance. He is director of the journal *History of Economic Thought and Policy* and is a board member of the University Association of European Studies (AUSE). He is also the academic coordinator of various European projects. He mainly deals with the history of economic thought, European and international economic and monetary integration; on these topics he has published several books and about a hundred articles. Former secretary general and vice president of the European Movement, he is the editorial director of the Euractiv Italia information portal, co-director of CESUE and Secretary General of the Robert Triffin International Foundation.
